




INTRODUCTION TO BLACKSMITHING WORKSHOP

Mace Vitale Session B: 4 Wednesdays beginning August 7 6:00 PM – 9:00 PM

Come learn the basics of forging steel in a fun and inclusive environment. Geared towards the absolute beginner, this workshop is designed to be educational and enjoyable for everyone. Under the guidance of experienced instructors, you will learn techniques to build confidence in the forge. Students will shape and forge hot steel using a hammer and an anvil to complete a variety of projects. Fee payable with tuition \$45.00.

Trivets are a classic cooking tool used to elevate a pot or pan in the hearth/firepit over a bed of coals for cooking, or as an item to place on the table to keep hot items off the table. This is a great introduction to forge welding for those looking to gain that skill set. Students will have the option to make one trivet with the possibility of forging up to the welding step on a second trivet, time permitting. Skills highlighted in this project are forging to specific measurements, accurately bending material, managing odd shaped items in the fire, upsetting and scarf theory and practice, weld and fire preparation, gauging temperatures. FORGING A COAT RACK WORKSHOP

Anna Koplik Saturday - Sunday, August 10 -11 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM

In this two-day beginner class students will be introduced to the art of blacksmithing in a fun and enthusiastic environment where they will focus on the basics of forging to create one-of-a-kind wall hanging, riveted coat racks. Students will start with the basics of how to effectively swing a hammer at the anvil and forge hot steel. From there they will learn various forging processes, including tapering, scrolling, bending, shouldering, and spreading steel. Finally, everyone will drill and rivet together their components to create a finished, functional coat rack. Fee payable with tuition \$45.00.

Our forge is an outdoor building that is only semi-enclosed; please dress accordingly. 

PRECIOUS METAL CLAY LEAF JEWELRY WORKSHOP

Amy DeLorenzo 3 Wednesdays beginning June 26 6:30 PM - 9:30 PM

Learn how to use Precious Metal Clay and leaves from your own garden to create one of a kind fine silver jewelry. Also learn about the Japanese practice of Shinrin-yoku, or forest bathing, which is said to be a great way to unplug and de-stress. Students will learn the zen-like process of painting thin layers of clay paste onto leaves to slowly build up thickness, as well as basic techniques of working with and firing Metal Clay. Students will also learn jewelry finishing techniques like fusing solder filled jump rings for bails or making their own earwires. More advanced techniques may be demonstrated if time permits. Some knowledge of working with Metal Clay will be helpful, but not necessary. (The instructor will have a small selection of leaves on hand in case the student doesn't have access to leaves of their own, or would prefer something different.) Materials fee payable to the instructor of approximately \$120.00 (fee may change due to the market) includes a set of tools to keep, metal clay, paste, and reference guides needed to create at least 2-4 finished pieces depending on size. Additional clay and paste may be purchased from the instructor to create even more.

SETTING STONES IN SILVER CLAY WORKSHOP

Demonstration/discussion of the silver metal clay slip-syringe for setting, prong setting, and channel setting will be included as time permits. Materials fee includes sufficient silver metal clay, supplies and handouts to complete class projects. Inexpensive faceted and cabochon stones, pre-formed settings and additional silver clay will be available for purchase at the workshop. Prerequisite: at least one other silver metal clay class or workshop. Basic metal clay working tools, including portable work-surface, are required and will not be provided. 
